2022 University of Pennsylvania Davis Projects for Peace Process

The <u>Kathryn Wasserman Davis Projects for Peace program</u> invites undergraduates (including graduating seniors) to design grassroots projects that they will implement during the summer, anywhere in the world. The projects judged to be the most promising and valuable will be funded at \$10,000 each. The program aims to encourage student initiative, innovation, and entrepreneurship, focusing on conflict prevention, resolution, or reconciliation.

The Davis Projects for Peace program accepts nominations from institutions – students may not apply independently. To apply to be one of Penn's nominees, you must complete the following steps by **Penn's Internal Deadline of January 18, 2022, at 4:00 pm.** A student or a group of students may apply for the award.

 Think about whom you will ask to write your (2) letters of support for your proposed project: The letter of support from a Penn mentor (faculty or staff) should discuss the proposed project's feasibility and the adequacy of the applicant's/applicants' preparation to complete it. It should also outline ways in which the applicant (or team of applicants) would be mentored over the course of the project and beyond The letter of support from a proposed project affiliate in the host community should acknowledge that you have been in contact with local partners, that your project is welcome, and that you will have access to necessary support and resources while on location You will request Penn nomination and register each recommender on CURF's Fellowship Nomination Request website. Recommendations must be submitted by Penn's internal deadline of Tuesday, January 18, 2022, at 4:00pm 	December 2021
